At Ridgetop, Dan, Lois, Seth & Mark continue the nurturing tradition of their cultural heritage - growing cherries, peaches and apples. Ridgetop Orchards grows, packs & ships fruit for domestic and export sales. Cherries are picked in early summer and can be purchased fresh from the tree. The orchard's many varieties of peaches and apples, along with specialty jams, preserves and salsas, are available for retail sale 'on the porch' and for gift shipping from mid to late summer through January.

The packing facility & porch retail store is in Fishertown, PA - just off Route 56.

Welcome to Snider Homestead Farms!

Seven generations strong, the Snider Homestead family of New Enterprise, was purchased by John and Amanda Snider in 1892, and is now home to great-great-granddaughter Berneta (Snider) and Brad Gable and their family.

When Berneta's father Bernard and uncle Obie took over the farm, they continued to milk Guernsey cattle until Obie purchased the nearby Singing Brook Farm and began milking Holsteins.





Berneta and Brad's son Aaron, along with his wife Amy (Liggett), daughters Bella and Blaire, and son Cannon, are on the original homestead, where they milk more than 120 Guernseys and 30 Holsteins. The Gables, along with two full-time employees and two part-time high school students, farm 400 acres, growing 100 acres of corn, 20 acres of barley and 200 acres of alfalfa and grass hay to balance the pasture.

The Gable's daughter, Kendy is also a vital part of the

farm. She reigned as the National Guernsey Queen in 2004. She now is a singer-songwriter in New York City where she teaches piano and voice and works on an urban farm. She helps at the farm and the cattle shows in her "spare" time when she comes home to Bedford County.

Snider Homestead Guernseys have earned significant show ring success, including exhibiting class winners and champions at the All American Dairy Show, and earning many Premier Breeder and Exhibitor banners, including consecutive honors from 2006 through 2012. Sniders Telestar Heaven was the family's first Grand Champion winner in 1993.

The National Dairy Shrine recognized Berneta with the 2013 Distinguished Dairy Cattle Breeder award because of her family's worldwide renown in breeding quality and sought-after Guernsey genetics.

During the 2015 Fall Farm Tour, the Gables invite you to enjoy a guided tour of their beautiful farm, *A Dairy of Distinction*, visit with this year's Bedford County Dairy Princess, Erin Jay and her royalty, and take the opportunity to learn about and appreciate the significant role of dairy farming in our daily lives.

Directions from I-99: Take Exit 3 Turn toward the Wal-Mart Distribution Center. Rose Family Farm Store is at the intersection of Rt. 56 and Pensyl Hollow Road.

Craig & Amy Rose say that their purpose in starting Rose Family Farm came from their desire to spend more time with their children. They also wanted to teach their children the value of an honest day's work and to experience the satisfaction of seeing through the process of clearing land, planting a seed, tending to it, and ultimately harvesting the fruit of their labor.



They believe the farm, which began near Gravity Hill in New Paris, but was recently relocated to Cessna, is also a great place to learn many important life lessons, from

losing animals they have grown attached to, to landing the monster bass from their irrigation pond, and learning perseverance and endurance as they navigate the many challenges that come with the farm life. They say they are continually learning from one another.



The Roses say they are always trying to improve their farm. They use conventional and conservation farming practices, but are proponents of the sustainable agriculture movement to ensure that the future generations will have the same opportunities afforded to them.

They grow a wide variety of tomatoes, cherry tomatoes, peppers, squash, cucumbers, and sweet corn. They also grow pumpkins, gourds, cantaloupe, broccoli, cabbage, kohlrabi,

and onions and more.

You can find them at a number of area Farmer's Markets, Like downtown Bedford and Ligonier, but they also recently opened their own Farm Store at the Cessna exit just off of I-99 near the Wal-Mart Distribution Center.

During the Fall Farm Tour, the Rose Family invites you to explore their farm store offerings, including a variety of fresh produce. Children will enjoy pumpkin decorating and coloring pages, as well as the opportunity to take fun fall photos.
